




EDUCATION CORNER

Zerubbabel: A Symbol of Restoration and Divine Purpose

Zerubbabel, a descendant of King David and governor of Judah after the Babylonian exile, holds deep significance in both biblical history and Christian theology. Tasked with rebuilding the Temple in Jerusalem (Haggai 1:1-2), he stands as a symbol of perseverance, faith, and divine restoration. His leadership, guided by the prophets Haggai and Zechariah, demonstrates how God empowers the faithful to overcome obstacles, as seen in the well-known declaration: "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord of hosts" (Zechariah 4:6).

For Christians, Zerubbabel prefigures Christ as the chosen servant of God through whom the ultimate spiritual temple—the Church—is established. His place in Jesus' genealogy (Matthew 1:12) underscores his role in God's redemptive plan. Within the Royal Arch tradition, Zerubbabel exemplifies steadfast dedication to divine purpose, reminding us that true strength comes not from earthly power, but through faith and obedience to God's will.



Equality Chapter No. 6
Hello from the South, SOUTH east corner of the state, Companions. Equality Chapter No. 6 resides in Equality, IL, a village of 600 residents. Originally chartered as Shawneetown Chapter No. 6 from 1846 until 1867. In 2006 they petitioned to be able to use that number again as Shawneetown masonic bodies had consolidated into Equality in the early 2000s. Notable charter members are MEPGHP Bruce Rhinehart and MEPGHP Everett Campbell. We currently sit at right around 35 companions. We meet at the Equality Masonic lodge hall and have a great working relationship with them as well as a Rainbow chapter that meets there.
