EDUCATION CORNER

The Most Excellent Master degree serves three main purposes in the Capitular system. The Most Excellent Master degree is designed to provide special recognition of Master Masons who have attained a sufficient proficiency in their preceding degrees to have learned the lessons contained in the degree. Therefore, those brethren who complete their labor in the oriental chair (Past Master) are enjoined to dispense the true Masonic knowledge to all uninformed brethren, as he now possesses the wisdom to do so.

Secondly, it is a necessary degree in the Craft Lodge because it is the only one that deals with the completion and dedication of the temple. In Craft Masonry, the candidate is always symbolically engaged in building the Temple of Solomon. However, due to the untimely death of Hiram Abif, the Temple is left uncompleted. While the Mark Master Degree also deals with the unfinished temple, the Royal Arch Degree shows the temple had already been destroyed. The Most Excellent Master Degree fills the void left between these events.

Thirdly, the Most Excellent Master Degree is riddled with allegoric symbolism. The completion and dedication of the Temple of King Solomon represents the completion of our spiritual temple, that house not made with hands, eternal in the Heavens. This degree prepares us for the secret contained in the Royal Arch Degree. One cannot dispense Masonic light until his own spiritual building is completed by the Keystone, thus binding it all together so that "all parts give and draw strength from each other."


Grand Chapter seen at Job's Daughters Preview Luncheon
